No person may qualify or serve as a member of the Old Town City Council if that person is currently married to a person who holds position of Old Town City Manager or head of any city department. A candidate may seek election to the city council notwithstanding disqualification under this paragraph, provided that if elected, the disqualification must be removed by resignation of the candidate's from the position concerned no later than the first regular City Council meeting following the candidate's election. If the disqualification been removed by such date, the candidate shall not be seated and the remaining City Council members shall declare a vacancy, to be filled in accordance with Article II, section 5 of this charter. A City Council member duly elected and qualified shall be deemed no longer qualified if a vacancy declared in accordance with Article II, section 5, if the council member's spouse is appointed to and accepts the position of Old Town City Manager or department head during the term for which the council member has been elected.

The polls shall be opened at 7:00 a.m. and closed at 8:00 p.m.

The Registrar of voters will hold office hours while the polls are open to correct any error in or change a name or address on the voting list; to accept the registration of any person who becomes 18 years of age on Election Day, or at the close of registration prior to it; and to accept new enrollments. A person who is not registered as a voter may not vote in the election.
