Sec. 7. Borrowing. Staff is requesting that City Council consider approving the demolition of structures on 17 Front Street and 27 Front Street, at a cost of \$7,000.

These two properties were taken by the City Council through the State of Maine's tax lien foreclosure process.

- 1. 17 Front Street has been offered twice publically for sale by sealed bid.

  The property was offered for a minimum bid of \$8,000 the second time, and no bids were submitted. Property is a very small lot and structure is in very poor condition.
- 2. 27 Front Street is in very poor shape, and is not in livable condition. It has not been put out to bid.

In preparation for this discussion with City Council a request for bids to demo these two properties was sent to 4 local contractors.
